The Start of the School Day

It is important for children and classes to have a smooth and calm start to the school day. We encourage the children to be as independent as they can be by saying goodbye and walking in to school, hanging up their coats, collecting their resources and saying good morning to all their friends – all good skills to have for the future.

School starts promptly at 8.50am for all children. The doors open at 8.40 for the children to come straight into school in order to prepare and settle themselves; the register is taken promptly at 8.50am.

Members of staff are outside to greet the children and families each morning, and to take any messages to the class teachers that are not on morning duty.

If you would like to speak to the class teacher about your child then please either leave a message with the adults on duty or ask to arrange an appointment to speak to the class teacher. Ideally, the mornings are a time for the children to come in and get settled in preparation for the day. I'm sure you'll appreciate that it is difficult for the class teacher to leave the classroom in the mornings. After school is a far better time as the class teacher can give you their undivided attention.

If you arrive at school after 8.50am you should take your child to reception. Mrs Cornelius will say whether the registers are still in the classes (the child can then go straight to class) or, if the registers have been returned, you will be asked to record your arrival time and reason in the Late Book.

Collecting Children from School

The school day finishes at 3.15pm, unless your child is attending an after school club or Fun Club. If you are going to be late collecting your child please ring the school office as soon as you can, so we can get a message to your child and their teacher. If a child has not been collected by 3.30pm and they are not at an after school club or Fun Club, we will phone to see who is picking up.

SIAMS Inspection (Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools)


