Some of you may have already heard that Highways are planning some essential road surfacing through Uley. The current update is that they have changed the dates to **Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> and Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> June**:

The access for parents will be provided as follows:

On 21st June, parents will be able to access the school from the north direction (Fiery Lane or Crawley Hill) whilst we work on the section between New Cut and Woodstock Terrace.

On 22nd June parents will be able to access the school from the south or via Fiery Lane. Residents' access will be maintained, however some delays may be expected.

All we ask is that everybody leaves in good time to get to/from school as there maybe short delays and to be mindful that parking may prove difficult.
