# Children's Questionnaire Results 2017-2018

Back in the summer term we asked the children for their views and have some pleasing results.

93% strongly agree or agree that they like school.
90% strongly agree or agree that they feel safe in school.
96% strongly agree or agree their teacher tell them how well they are going.
93% strongly agree or agree they can talk to staff if they need help.
95% strongly agree or agree they are doing well.

# Swimming Consultation - Uley School swimming from September 2019

Last summer we sent out a letter regarding swimming provision at Uley School and the financial implications. Thank you for the responses of which we received 30. You shared your thoughts and opinions and we are very grateful for this.

As you can see the majority of responses wish for swimming to continue for Years 1-6 and there were strong views in support of Option 4. Uley Schools feels that swimming is a crucial life skills that all children should have the opportunity to learn, and you agree. Some responses also feel that the more swimming lessons the children receive the better. There were some value points and suggestions made for Options 1, 2 and 3 that will continue to be considered for future such as one class swimming for a longer period.

Over the past year we have introduced ParentPay to pay for swimming and this has been positively received. We also send reminders out to those that have overlooked payments.

What next - we will continue to provide swimming lessons to all children from Year 1 to Year 6 for 2019-2020 and will continue to monitor payments. The overall financial situation of swimming will continue to be monitored by Governors. We will also continue to remind those who find paying difficult to come and speak to us.
