Woodstock Terrace and the use of Cars

The use of Woodstock Terrace for dropping off and collecting has been brought to the school's attention again. The use of Woodstock Terrace for dropping off and collecting should be avoided. Local residents are unhappy as to the chaos it creates, the use of private driveways for turning around and have concerns about the speed in which cars travel. The school requests that cars park on the main Uley road and walk children down to the school via Woodstock Terrace or park mindfully, avoiding yellow lines and the resident's car park, in South Street. Please ensure that all children are supervised in the school playground prior to doors opening at 8.40am. School staff are around to take responsibility from 8.40am. Should you require child care before 8.40am, please speak to Breakfast Club about booking a place



Medication for Illness versus Medication for a Medical Need

Prescribed Medication to support a Medical Condition

The school has a policy for Supporting Pupils with Medical Needs at School, which can be found on the school website. This policy explains how we ensure children with medical conditions are properly supported so that they have full access to education, including school trips and physical education. Medical conditions are typically asthma, diabetes, epilepsy, anaphylaxis etc. The school staff are trained to administer prescribed medication and support families with these types of conditions.

For non-prescribed medicines including Calpol and even cough sweets, please speak to the school. The school will always ask if the child is well enough to be in school. All medication should be handed into the school to ensure the safety and well-being of other children.

Non-prescribed Medication for Short Term Illness

Over the counter medicines, e.g. hay-fever treatments, cough/cold remedies should only be accepted in exceptional circumstances, and be treated in the same way as prescription medication. The parent/carer must clearly label the container with the child's name, dose and time of administration and complete a Consent Form. Staff should check that the medicine has been administered without adverse effect in the past and that parents have certified that this is the case – a note to this effect should be recorded in the written parental agreement for the school/setting to administer medicine.

Antibiotics for Illness

When a child has been prescribed an antibiotic for illness, we suggest that the child has at least a full day's dose before returning to school if they are well enough.

Parent/carers should be encouraged to ask the GP to prescribe an antibiotic which can be given outside of school/setting hours wherever possible. Most antibiotic medication will not need to be administered during school/setting hours.

Twice daily doses should be given in the morning before school/setting and in the evening. Three times a day doses can normally be given in the morning before school/setting, immediately after (provided this is possible) and at bed-time. It should normally only be necessary to give antibiotics in school/setting if the dose needs to be given four times a day, in which case a dose is needed at lunchtime.

There is a potential risk of interaction between prescription and over the counter medicines so where children are already taking prescription medicine(s), prior written approval from the child's GP should be considered. The use of non-prescribed medicines should normally be limited to a 24hr period and in all cases not exceed 48hrs.

If symptoms persist medical advice should be sought by the parent. Other remedies, including herbal preparations, will not be accepted for administration in school.

School Attendance

Uley School attendance data released in January 2019 reveals that Uley School for the period of 2017/18, was above national for the rate of overall absence compared to that of similar schools.

Uley School 4.90%

Similar Schools 3.80%.

This of course isn't great news and is disappointing. It is clearly an area which the school needs to address. In May, along with the Local Authority, the school will be looking in to attendance information to identify areas we need to improve. We will keep you notified of any changes to the school's Attendance Policy.

A polite reminder that holidays and days out during term time should be avoided and will not be authorised unless there are exceptional circumstances. Exceptional circumstances are:

- Rare
- Significant
- Unavoidable
- Short

Lateness after 9am is counted as unauthorised and therefore contributes to the school's overall absence. The school door opens at 8.40am to allow children to come in and organise themselves for the day ahead, registers are taken at 8.50am and children are marked as present. The register will be marked with an 'L' for arrival after 8.50am but before 9am, after 9am the register is marked as unauthorised.

Please come and speak to us if you are having any difficulties with morning routines or attendance as we may be able to help in some way.

Uley School Uniform

The governors and staff have recently reviewed the school uniform.

What is meant by Sensible Summer Sandals?

The children can continue to wear typical school shoes during the summer term, as they do throughout the autumn and spring terms. Thermal boots maybe a bit too hot in the warm weather though!

We have made some clarifications around 'sensible summer sandals'. These are sandals that keep the foot well positioned and secure unlike flip flops, between the toe or around the ankle sandals. Good examples of sensible summer sandal look like:







From the next academic year 2019 – 2020 the policy will be updated. The policy will state that the sensible summer sandals will need to be ideally black, brown, red or white.

Polo Shirts

It has been pointed out that white is not the most suitable colour for daily use due to its inability to hide most dirty marks! This has been considered by the school and therefore a decision has been made to change the white polo shirt to red for the next academic year – 2019-2020. This will also complement our red sweatshirt which will be useful when out and about, as our children will be easily identifiable at all times. Red polo shirts with the school logo will be available from Batemans or you can purchase red polos shirts from most supermarkets.

End of Year Reports

We are making some changes, for the better, to the end of year school report format from Year 1 to Year 6. The Foundation Stage reports will currently stay the same.

The main changes are:

We will be reporting on whether your child is in line with age-related expectations for the year group, above age-related expectations for the year group or below. This is in all curriculum areas. Please see the chart below.

We've included a code for 'Attitude to Learning'. Please see the chart below.

We will be reporting on all areas of English and Maths such as phonics, addition and subtraction. Hopefully, it should make ease of reading easier!

We've included a section on areas to focus on at home for English and Maths, which will help support your child's learning.

End of year attendance will be clearer. Attendance will be categorised in to green, amber and red. You will also receive a breakdown of attendance information from September that year.

The Good Shepherd Project

The Good Shepherd Project aims to support schools to recognise and celebrate that they are part of the Diocese of Gloucester family. There are 118 church schools in this community and in order to connect with them Gloucester Diocese have launched this project. Nine life-size sheep models will travel around all of the schools throughout the year, spending approximately 7-10 days in each school. It is a deanery based project, with one sheep going around the schools in each deanery.

Each school has been asked to decorate the sheep in an individual way, using its logo, a distinctively Christian vision statement or another piece of artwork inspired by this project. As well as this, each school will fill in a diary entry of how the sheep has been involved in the school and parish life and include photos or samples of inspired school-work.
