## End of Year Reports

We are making some changes, for the better, to the end of year, school report format from Year 1 to Year 6. The Foundation Stage reports will currently stay the same.

The main changes are:

- We will be reporting on whether your child is in line with age-related expectations for the year group, above age -related expectations for the year group or below. This is in all curriculum areas. Please see the chart below.
- We've included a code for 'Attitude to Learning'. Please see the chart below.

- We will be reporting on all areas of English and Maths such as phonics, addition and subtraction. Hopefully, it should make easier reading!
- We've included a section of areas to focus on at home for English and Maths, which will help support your child's learning.
- End of year attendance will be clearer. Attendance will be categorised in to green, amber and red. You will also receive a breakdown of attendance information from September that year.

#### **Assessments and Statutory Tests**

It's that time of year again when schools administer statutory assessments at the end of KS2, KS1 and Y1 Phonics Screening. We know these tests do not measure all the talents the children have but we encourage them to be the best they can be and showcase their knowledge and skills– and they certainly do. Any questions on any of the assessments mentioned below please come and ask. Uley School also has an Assessment Policy which can be found on the school website by clicking on 'Documents and Policies'.

#### • Year 6 Statutory Assessments

Statutory assessment week is well under way for the Year 6s. These tests, apart from writing, are marked externally.

#### • Year 2 Statutory Assessments

The Year 2 statutory assessments are a type of assessment used to support the class teacher's, teacher assessment. During the month of May, and kept very low key, the Year 2s will complete a Maths and reading paper. It is not unu sual to ask the children to complete an assessment if they are able to access one.

#### • Year 1 Phonic Screening.

During June the Year 1s will read a mixture of 40 real and pseudo phonically decodable words. 32 has been the pass mark since the introduction of the screening in 2012. It is made fun and accessible to the children with the use of hu morous monster pictures.

## • Year 4 Multiplication Tests

You may have already heard that there will be a statutory multiplication test for Year 4s due to be implemented in June 2020. For this year we will be having a go at the voluntary trial to help us familiarise ourselves with the check so that we are ready for 2020. The national curriculum specifies that pupils should be taught to recall the multiplication tables up to and including  $12 \times 12$  by the end of Year 4.

## Transition

We have already started to think about the new academic year ahead, the staff and class structures and children moving year groups – I know, but the last few weeks of the summer term fly by so quickly!

Due to the small size of our school, all the staff are privileged to know the children across all of the year groups. In addition, the children are also familiar with all the different adults who help and work at Uley as classes, groups and key stages frequently work together on projects or in subjects areas such as phonics and spelling.

At Uley School we acknowledge that moving to the next class or phase of education is exciting and can sometimes be a little daunting. We always support your child through these changes to ensure a smooth transition.

We begin the preparation for the next stage in their journey through 'getting to know you' sessions. These sessions are planned for:

Monday 19<sup>th</sup> June, am Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> June, pm Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> July, am

Staff will also have opportunities for 'handing over' information from one class to another.
