Class 1 Newsletter - Autumn 2019

Literacy

We have begun assessing the children's understanding of phonics and group children accordingly. Most Reception children will begin with Phase 2 sounds - SATPIN.

Each letter is taught along with the sound it makes and has an action to accompany it to help the children remember them. For more information on this please ask. We will also be reading a selection of 'pirate' and 'castles' related stories - including J.M.Barrie's 'Peter Pan'. Our work will also include some poetry linked to fireworks and sea shanties. In Maths, we will be learning through a variety of play-based activities to include both number and shape work. We will begin to learn how to do basic addition and subtraction, place value and patterns, as well as learning about odd and even numbers. All of the children have a Mathletics login which allows them access to a range of mathematical games to play from home on a tablet or PC. Look out for your child's login in their book bags.

Linking with our science and literacy work, we will be creating a variety of castles and boats using a range of materials.
