Free School Meals

What are the qualifying criteria for Free School Meals?

Your child might be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- Children who get paid these benefits directly, instead of through a parent or guardian, can also get free school meals.

All children are entitled to free school meals from Reception through to Year 6, even the infants who already receive universal free school meals. Please speak to a member of staff if you think you may be entitled to Traditional Free School Meals.

Our centres are still closed for the time being but we are using our local volunteers as delivery hubs. Some deliver everyday but others are now operating three times a week (see below for our schedule).

All voucher requests should still come through the office which is manned every day. Voucher requests can't always be actioned that day due to coordinating with volunteer teams, see the schedule for deadlines as they vary per area. Any voucher arriving after 2pm they may fall to the next delivery slot depending on our work load. Please let your client know what to expect to manage expectations.

Once we receive a voucher request, a volunteer on the delivery shift will call the household to find out what else they might like and ask about any dietary requirements. These will be packed and delivered.

We have seen a big increase in the frequency of visits to the Foodbank over the past 6 months, and we have been aware that it has been a challenging time for all. So we haven't been following too closely to the 3 vouchers in a 6 month period guidelines, however – we may be in touch on a case by case basis to make sure no-one falls through the cracks.

We are recommending agencies sign up to become an e-referrer. It's a simple way of issuing vouchers online and is highly secure. Do contact us at the office if you would be interested. <u>office@strouddistrictfoodbank.org.uk</u>

Our last full working day of the year is 23rd December – vouchers will need to be requested by mid-day to be actioned. Office will be closed from 24th December to the 4th January.

Healthy Start Vouchers

With Healthy Start, you get free vouchers every week to spend on milk, fresh, frozen, and tinned fruit and vegetables, fresh, dried, and tinned pulses, and infant formula milk. You can also get free vitamins.

Families with children under the age of four or if there is a pregnancy could qualify if on benefits, or if pregnant and under 18.

Due to the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic we've temporarily extended the validity of the Healthy Start vouchers by 4 weeks, giving you 12 weeks to use your entitlement, we will keep this under review.
