Covid Free Christmas Please!

It is really important to self-isolate if you or your child(ren) have been identified as being in contact with someone who has tested positive.

How to self-isolate

You must not leave your home if you're self-isolating.

Don't

- do not go to work, school or public places work from home if you can
- do not go on public transport or use taxis
- do not go out to get food and medicine order it online or by phone, or ask someone to bring it to your home
- do not have visitors in your home, including friends and family except for people providing essential care
- do not go out to exercise exercise at home or in your garden, if you have one

Once school has finished on Friday, please follow the procedures below to report any confirmed cases:

- 1. Parents/carers and staff must continue to inform the school of confirmed cases if symptoms developed within 48 hours of last being in school.
- 2. Parents/carers of pupils and staff who were not symptomatic but tested positive within 48 hours of last being in school also need to let the school know.
- 3. Where a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms more than 48 hours since last being in school, the school should not be notified. Parents and carers should then follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.

By following these procedures for any confirmed positive cases, please email covid@uley.gloucs.sch.uk. This email will be checked daily up to 24th December 2020 If a positive case is reported to the school, we will be in touch and advise self-isolation to those that have had contact.
