Record your findings as a charity information board. Be creative! <b>10 team points</b></p>	<p><b>'Flower Head'</b> Steel Flower</p>   <p>Buenos Aires – Argentina. Above is a sculpture that responds to sunlight. As the sun rises it opens and as the sunsets it closes. Can you make a flower sculpture? Could it have a moving part? <b>5 team points</b></p>	<p><b>'Explorers Dance'</b></p> <p>We are creating dance moves to show us going on a Journey to a new land.</p> <p>Could you design the new land that we might arrive at? <b>5 team points</b></p> 	<p><b>'Value Perseverance'</b></p> <p>Is a Paralympic value! Can you create a poster to celebrate a Paralympian?</p> <p><b>5 team points</b></p>  <p><b>"Being My Best"</b></p> <p>Set yourself a personal target &amp; share it with us in writing including any progress. <b>2 team points</b></p> 	<p><b>'Music'</b></p> <p>Display the <u>Waves Pinterest board</u>. Look at the paintings and discuss what they show. Encourage your child to find similarities and difference. Can create a sound-scape (use voice &amp; body movements) to accompany one of these paintings? You might choose to paint your own wave picture.</p> <p><b>5 team points</b></p>
