Please support your child to choose a minimum of four activities to complete at home over this term. Children can bring homework in during the week 16<sup>th</sup> March. Please note, most of the ideas below came from the children!

<b>Freedom and fun</b> Research the dwellings used by indigenous people of the Arctic. Build one out of any media you like. 10 team points 	<b>Love of the written word</b> Create a tourist leaflet advertising your imaginary world. 5 team points 	<b>Maths, science and analysis</b> Find 10 <i>interesting</i> facts about an Arctic or Antarctic animal. 5 team points 3	<b>Church and community</b> Write an acrostic poem about Easter. 5 team points 	<b>Music and dance</b> Research traditional music and dance of the indigenous people of the Arctic. Could you recreate one? 10 team points 
<b>Ideas and imagination</b> Make a puppet show detailing the story of the Titanic. You will need to create a script, sets and puppets! 15 team points 	<b>Freedom and fun</b> Create your own homework. ? team points – it depends on what you do! 			<b>Church and community</b>  Our value is perseverance. Ask each member of the family to write (on identical pieces of paper) a challenge that will require perseverance to complete. Place it in a bag with the others. Invite each person to pick out a challenge which they have one week to complete. 10 team points
<b>Love of the written word</b> Write a non-chronological report about your imaginary world. 15 team points 	<b>Awareness of our place in the world, geographically and socially</b> Research places in the Arctic or Antarctic – specifically how they have changed over the last twenty years. What statistics can you find? 10 team points 	<b>Maths, science and analysis</b> Design and build a bridge to span a 50cm gap (between two tables in the classroom) What materials will you use? How will you make it sturdy? 15 team points 3	<b>Sport and fair play</b> What traditional sports are played by the indigenous people of the Arctic? Have a go! 5 team points
