<p>Take a walk around your local area. Using a camera, capture some highlights on your trip. Can you spot anything unusual? Are you able to capture an image of the local landscape?</p>	<p>We have many rivers, canals and streams in our local area. Can you create a piece of music to represent the journey of a river or stream?</p>	<p>Create your own mini model of your local area or your home. This can be made out of art resources you can find at home or using a range of websites such as Minecraft or within an animation. Can you show perseverance when making your models?</p>	
<p>Create your own homework inspired by your local area.</p>	<p>Can you research about the famous John Daniels and have a go at creating an image of a gorilla? This could be in the form of baking, within a piece of artwork or sketching?</p>	<p>This term's topic is the 'The street beneath my feet.'</p> <p>For this topic, we are going to be exploring our local area and learning about the rise and the fall of the Uley woollen trade. Can you have a go at completing a range of homework activities linked to our topic focus this term?</p> 	<p>Can you find out what Britain's most popular wildlife is? Can you compare Britain's wildlife to wildlife around the world? Think about the size of the animals, their habitats and whether they are becoming endangered.</p>
<p>Can you participate in some exercise or run around your local area? Are you able to time yourself completing the challenge? How far did you run? Can you repeat the run and see if you can beat your score?</p>	<p>Can you research some of the famous people who used to live in Uley? Were any of them linked to the wool trade? Did any of them work at the local workhouse?</p>	<p>Can you research and find out who are the most famous authors within the United Kingdom? Which is your favourite author? Why? What books would you recommend to someone else?</p>
