# Homework topic webs

In Class 4, the children are encouraged to complete both the homework topic web as well as their weekly spelling homework each term. The homework topic web is linked to all areas of the curriculum and each piece of homework encourages a skill relating to 'research', 'make', 'apply' or 'practice'. The children in Class 4 also play an active role in discussing and choosing a range of homework activities that they would like to complete, relating to our topics. We do ask children to try to complete a range of homework pieces across a range of subject areas. The homework will be shared and celebrated within the class once all the homework has been received.

# Weekly spelling homework

Each week, the children will be learning a new set of spellings based upon a particular spelling pattern. These will be sent home for them to practise, and we will be practising daily in daily spelling sessions. There is no need to hand in this spelling homework.

Finally, can I remind you of the many ways you can also support your child's learning at home which can be invaluable in supporting your child's whole development:

Please hear your child read regularly. Research has shown that 10 minutes daily reading has proven to help a
child make a year's extra progress – quite an astounding amount! I have given all children a reading record
to help you record this.
