Governor Visits

Barry Kordula came to visit during anti-bullying week:

It was a very positive visit to the school to see PE and PSHE (anti-bullying week focus).

I visited all four classes. Classes 1, 2 and 4 were discussing relationships and bullying, appropriate for each of their age ranges. All the pupils were listening to each other and supporting each other with understanding to the topics being discussed and tasks being set.

I spoke to the CHIP council about relationships and bullying. They were full of confidence and willing to discuss the different topics and questions I asked them. They answered honestly and maturely and felt there was no bullying in school. If they had any disagreements with friends, they were able to resolve these with or without adult support. The children felt confident they could approach a member of staff and request help with anything.

The children were positive about the Buddy system in school and with how My Happy Mind has helped them to develop strategies in school to help them cope with emotions by using breathing techniques.

Class 3 (PE) were engaged in hockey outside. I saw good teamwork with children working together and helping each other.

As a parent governor, it felt great being in school and the fact there was so many positive and thoughtful pupils willing to support and help each other out.

A Message from Gloucestershire County Council

Before The National Year of Reading 2026 kicks off, we want to know as much as we can about the current reading attitudes and behaviours of children and young people in Gloucestershire. There are currently 91,000 school aged children and young people on roll in schools and colleges in Gloucestershire and we want to hear from as many of them as we can.

How we will use the data

Please start completing the surveys as soon as you are enable and ensure all surveys are complete by the end of Friday 9th January 2026.

The Year of Reading delivery group – consisting of multiple organisations across the county - will analyse and publish the findings from this survey by the end of January 2026. We will use the data to help us deliver targeted reading activity to help get as many children and young people reading as possible.

As well as county wide data, as long as all of your pupils complete their **school name**, we will share your school data with you which should be useful for SIPs and your own reporting and planning.

This survey will be repeated at the end of 2026 to evaluate any impact of The Year of Reading in individual schools and across the county.

School Closures

Making the decision to close a school is quite a challenge as there are so many factors to consider. In the event of a closure, the decision will be as early as possible. For those uncertain circumstances such as snow, the decision to close may need to take place early in the morning to allow for additional information such as monitoring of the area, updated weather forecasts and information from the Local Authority.

In the event that the school has to close, such as snow, the procedures are:

- You will receive a text message
- A message will be posted on the Gloucestershire County Council website so please check: http://ww3.gloucestershire.gov.uk/closedschools/
- A message will be posted on the school website

Work will be provided during school closures. This will be sent out via email initially before posting on the school website.

Don't forget that staff are happy to arrange to speak with you, should you:

- like an update on your child's progress other than Parent's Evenings
- like more information on how to support your child at home
- like to celebrate your child's achievements in and out of school
- have a worry
- have any questions about your child's education
- need clarification/reminders on information

Years 3 and 4 recently took part in a football tournament at Rednock. They had a fantastic time and came third out of the small schools! Mrs Trotman was very impressed with their attitude and sportsmanship. Well done!





Class 3 had a wonderful Anglo Saxon and Viking day!!! Nick Aka 'Edwin', who taught us lots about why we we're invaded, how Anglo- Saxons and Vikings lived and eventually what happened after the Norman invasion!!! Lots of learning through games, exploring artefacts and having a wonderful enriched experiences.

Class 4 have been learning all about the circulatory system in science, now we have learned the functions of the blood, blood vessels and heart, we are looking at the effect that exercise has on the heart. We developed our own investigation to test which type of exercise (aerobic, strengthening, balancing and stretching) has the most effect on our heart rates.



In geography, **Class 4** have been learning about road safety. We learned about the Highway Code and we watched videos of the Green Cross Code. We learnt how to cross the road safely and made posters about staying safe when crossing the road and while driving.













In **Class 2**, we have been preparing for the Nativity by sequencing and retelling the Christmas story. This story brings Christians Good News –"Jesus was born and when he grew up he would be with his disciples," **Emilio.**



Class 1 have been enjoying drawing club. A fun way to introduce ambitious vocabulary and encourage writing through drawing and magic codes. Mrs Delrosa wears her magic cloak for drawing club which makes her magic codes work and, in her imagination, amazing things happen. The children draw their own pictures with codes which also make magical things happen. These drawings are linked to the fabulous book 'The Wonky Donkey'.
