CONTACT TRACING OVER THE FEBRUARY HALF-TERM

For the purposes of contact tracing, please inform the school if your child tests positive AND the symptoms have developed within the 48 hours of the last day of being in school. This is so that close contacts can be identified and asked to self-isolate. The covid@uley.gloucs.sch.uk email will be checked regularly.

If your child tests positive and the symptoms developed more than 48 hours since the last day of being in school, then the school does not need to be informed, only of self-isolation absence which can be reported on the first day back.

TRIM TRAIL

Exciting news... we will be replacing the trim trail on the top playground next to the school field and adding a few new exciting features to the main playground.

Other developments.....

Parent Consultations. We are currently exploring an online booking system for parent consultations and this will also include video consultations. More information will follow.

School Roof Replacement to the back of the school (offices, toilets, staff room). These works are being planned from the Easter holidays onwards for approximately 8 weeks. We will keep you updated with any changes that may impact as a school.

HEALTHY START - SEE PDF ATTACHED

If you're pregnant or have a child under 4 and you are getting benefits, you may be able to get Healthy Start vouchers to help buy some basic foods. You also qualify if you are under 18 and pregnant, even if you don't get any benefits. This important scheme provides vouchers to spend with local retailers and also gives you access to free vitamins. Pregnant women and children over 1 and under 4 can get one £3.10 voucher per week. Children under 1 can get two £3.10 vouchers (£6.20) per week. Find out if you are eligible to get these benefits. If you're not eligible, click here to see the alternative grants and funds available. Once you have applied for your vouchers and your application has been approved, you will receive your vouchers for food and vitamins (see Spend your vouchers for more information on how to spend them).

VIRTUAL MEETING PLATFORMS

It is great to hear so many children are meeting socially via a range of different platforms and this is a really good way for children to keep in touch with each other and to keep their spirits up.

Microsoft Teams is the Uley School choice of platform to provide an education to remote learners. We have come on a long way with using Teams and it is great to see everyone embracing its potential. Teams has a chat section which can be used to send messages and for video calling. It is important to keep the @uley school teams account for educational purposes only. Teams is free and for everyone to use therefore we recommend that should families wish to use Teams in addition to school due to knowing how it works, we would recommend either setting up a new personal email address or using your own existing personal email address to login into Teams with. This will create another channel for them to use and will not impact on the school's teaching. As always, it is important that parents monitor any interactions outside of school use in order to keep everybody safe and happy.
