What super attendance last Friday. It was a happy atmosphere and a little bit of quality time to stop and spend a relaxed morning in school with the children. Thank you again for all who attended.




Staffing Updates

Mrs. Kirsty Harbin will be joining the Uley Team from September, not only as SENDCo support, but as Class 1 teacher on a Monday and PPA (planning, preparation and assessment) cover across Classes 2, 3 and 4.

Skin Health

Young skin is delicate and very easily damaged by the sun. In hope and preparation of the sun regularly shining, please slap on a sunhat and slop on plenty of sun cream before school. At school the children are encouraged to slurp plenty of water. Please also put some clearly named sun cream in your child's bag. The children will be encouraged to apply this independently so please consider the application method e.g. tube, roll on etc.



Clarification on Going Outside in the Sun

During the sunny weather, the children do go outside and are encouraged to play in the shade and to use the nature area. There may be occasions when staff use their discretion after assessing risk, that some areas are out of bounds for example, play equipment in wet weather, high winds and the occasional dead animal.

We ask all parents to slop on some extra sun cream before coming to school and to please provide a hat. We make sure the children keep hydrated. The children are encouraged to stay in the shaded areas (which fluctuates throughout the day and we do have less shade by lunchtime) and to take breaks from racing around. School can receive weather warnings from GCC, for example, the most recent weather warning was for high winds, and any warnings will be risk assessed accordingly with the children's safety as the priority.

Clarification on Before and After School Booking

All Year:
